Sun Country Announces Jackson Hole Airport Operations to Begin May 2021

Service added to 9 Airports Across the Country

Jackson, Wyoming – Sun Country Airlines will begin service at the Jackson Hole Airport beginning May 26, 2021, with service to Minneapolis twice weekly on Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Sun Country Airlines announced the addition of 16 nonstop flights, adding nine airports to its growing network. The expansion includes nine nonstop routes from Minneapolis-St. Paul International Airport (MSP), two new nonstop routes from Dallas Fort Worth International Airport (DFW) and George Bush Intercontinental Airport (IAH) and one additional nonstop route from San Antonio International Airport (SAT), Indianapolis International Airport (IND) and Bradley International Airport (BDL).

The airline welcomes Bradley International Airport (BDL), John Wayne Airport (SNA), George Bush Intercontinental Airport (IAH), Raleigh-Durham International Airport (RDU), Glacier Park International Airport (FCA), Fairbanks International Airport (FAI), Jackson Hole Airport (JAC), Indianapolis International Airport (IND) and Cincinnati/Northern Kentucky International Airport (CVG) to its growing network.

Jackson Hole Airport recognizes the community is currently focused on the pandemic and safety and hopes that by May 2021, widespread vaccines for COVID-19 along with current stringent regulations, will ensure travel continues to make strides in safety.

Through Sun Country Airlines, the Jackson Hole community will have additional options for flight service to and from JAC.

As an airport, we have the responsibility to our community while also providing services to incoming airlines who have a desire to operate out of JAC. Sun Country Airlines has chosen JAC from their own research and we will, as always, work to provide good service while maintaining the highest safety and sanitation standards of our facility.
